FARMINGTON BOARD OF SELECTMEN

Tuesday, May 11, 2021 6:30 P.M.

The meeting was conducted through remote access by telephonic, video, and electronic means. The public was able to attend by viewing the livestream at http://mtbluetv.org/program-live-stream-farmington-selectmen.html or Facebook at https://www.facebook.com/MBTV11/ and/or calling 778-5874.

Chairman Matthew Smith called the meeting to order at 6:30 P.M. with the following members present: Stephan Bunker, Scott Landry, and Joshua Bell. Michael Fogg was unable to attend. Town Manager Richard Davis, Town Secretary Nancy Martin, Deputy Police Chief Shane Cote, and Conservation Commission Members Bill Haslam and Sally Speich were present. Mt. Blue TV camera operator Tom Martin and members of the public were also present. Members of the press participated remotely as authorized by PL 209, c.617.

Votes were taken by roll call.

ITEM 1: Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Chairman Smith led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Richard Davis reviewed the new and renewal applications for Innkeeper and Lunch Wagon Permits. Scott Bubier and Laura Knox of Bubier's Hotdogs were present and answered the Selectmen's questions. Mr. Bubier stated that they have not finalized their schedule for hours of operation or location(s) yet. Ms. Knox stated that they are currently developing their menu, which will offer red hotdogs and homemade relishes. The Ugly Dumpling owner, Lou Sarofeen stated that they will offer Asian inspired cuisine, including dumplings, ramen noodles, Rangoons, and various appetizers. The Ugly Dumpling food truck will operate out of Gifford's parking lot and will work area fairs and special events.

ITEM 3: To Proclaim May 16 to 22, 2021 as Arbor Week in Farmington

Richard Davis introduced Farmington Conservation Commission Chairman Bill Haslam and member Sally Speich. Mr. Haslam reported that 2021 is the 50th anniversary of the Conservation Commission. This is the 44th year Farmington's been recognized as TREE CITY, USA by the Maine Forest Service and National Arbor Day Foundation. Mr. Haslam stated that the Conservation Commission and volunteers will plant trees in honor of Arbor Week. The Conservation Commission will gather at 8:00 A.M. at Meeting House Park on Saturday, May 29th. Volunteers are welcome to join them. They will replace the three lilac trees that went missing from downtown, spruce up the existing trees, and weed the downtown trees. Mr. Haslam stated that the Conservation Commission received a Project Canopy grant to create an invasive species guide. A few years ago, they took an inventory of street trees and will use that information as their embarkation point. Mr. Haslam reported that Emerald Ash Borer is bound to come here soon, and it will negatively impact ash trees. The Conservation Commission will assess how many ash trees are in the downtown area that might be affected and what can be done to mitigate the problem. Mr. Haslam stated that there are invasive plant species throughout the town, and the Conservation Commission will begin educating the public on the subject and will provide some avenues to treat the problem. On June 10th at 7:00 A.M. Mr. Haslam and Conservation Commission Member Patty Cormier will discuss invasive species on Senator Tom Saviello's television show, Talkin' Maine (Mt. BlueTV).

Five (5) pavement reclamation and paving bids were received with total costs ranging from \$159,140 to \$226,529. Mr. Hutchins recommended that the bid be awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder, All States Construction. Charlie Emerson of All States Construction was present and answered the Selectmen's questions. Mr. Hutchins stated that All States Construction did a good job when they worked on the Clover Mill Road, Ski Slope Road, Webster Road, and Front Street.

The Police Department solicited bids to replace two (2) of its oldest cruisers, 2013 and 2014 interceptor sedans. Request for bids were sent out to five (5) local Ford dealers, and the Town received three (3) bids from two dealers. Chief Charles recommended the bid be awarded to Quirk Ford for two (2) 2020 Ford Interceptor SUV cruisers for a total cost of \$79,142, which includes upfitting costs. Deputy Chief Shane Cote was present and answered the Selectmen's questions.

ITEM 13: To Discuss Other Business

- A. Richard Davis reported that the High Street project is a Municipal Partnership Initiative (MPI) project with MaineDOT funding half of the project up to \$500,000. Along with the High Street project, the Town is going to complete another small project on Farmington Falls Road (at the end of High Street). There is a steep embankment that is eroding and is causing drainage issues for the owner of the Barefoot Farmer. The MaineDOT will fund half the cost to install riprap and perhaps a couple of catch basins to stabilize the embankment and direct the drainage flow. The estimated cost of \$50,000 would be split between the Town and MaineDOT.
- **B.** Stephan Bunker stated that on Saturday, May 22nd, the American Legion will place U.S. flags on the veterans' graves. On Memorial Day, the American Legion will do their traditional wreath laying ceremony at the World War I Monument, Meeting House Park, and the American Legion Post. There will be no live gatherings or parades.
- **C.** Matthew Smith stated that the Emblem Club will conduct a flag folding ceremony at Meeting House Park.

There being no further business to come before the Board, Joshua Bell moved to adjourn at 7:21 P.M.; Scott Landry seconded.
